The programming includes various seminars and workshops; musical, theatrical or dance performances; and exhibitions of works by and about refugees, former and current alike, who make up Montreal's social fabric.

**Are you** or have you been a refugee, or do you work with refugees? Come speak about your experiences and the realities in the field, or about the various issues surrounding the taking in of refugees and asylum seekers.

**Are you** an expert on immigration rights, or a historian with an interest in the different waves of migration to Montreal, or a sociologist with a passion for integration and interculturalism? Come teach us what you know.

Are you an artist, in any discipline, and are you currently going through such an experience or have you in the past, and/or does your work broach this topic? Contact us to see how your work might be integrated into our programming.

All performances must be brief and on a small scale. The aim is not to achieve spectacular effects, but rather to promote encounters, in an intimate setting conducive to sharing. All works of art for display must be suitable for hanging in a Tempostyle shelter, in the public space.
